TRASH COLLECTION INFORMATION

Solid Waste

- ◆ Household garbage shall be picked up once a week on the curb or adjacent to the back alley and must be out no later than 7:00 a.m. on collection day
- ◆ Garbage shall be placed in the 96 gallon roller cart
- ◆ Do not place the roller cart within 15 feet of any utility pole, power line, mail box, car, fixtures, plants or other obstacles
- ◆ Do not place roller cart where it will block sidewalks, streets and/or back alleys to obstruct traffic or pedestrians
- ◆ Do not cover water meters, or storm drains

Yard Trimmings

- ◆ Yard trimmings shall be picked up once a week on the same day as your roller cart (one truck load per week) and must be placed on the curb or adjacent to the back alley and must be out no later than 7:00 a.m.
- ◆ Yard trimmings shall be placed separately from all other materials (it cannot be mixed with solid waste)
- ◆ Yard trimmings shall not be boxed, bagged, or placed in any type of container, unless the container is biodegradable, with a volume not in excess of 30 gallons
- ◆ Limbs shall not exceed six (6) inches in diameter or five (5) feet in length (yard trimmings exceeding diameter and length will not be collected)
- ◆ Grass trimmings need to be placed in a pile on the curb or adjacent to the back alley and will be picked up on the same day as your roller cart
- ◆ Do not blow grass clippings into the street unless you are sweeping them into a pile and placed on the curb or adjacent to the back alley
- ◆ Do not place yard trimmings within 15 feet of any utility pole, power line, mail box, car, fixtures, plants or other obstacles
- ◆ Do not place yard trimmings where it will block sidewalks, streets or back alleys (must not obstruct traffic or pedestrians right of way)
- ◆ Do not cover water meters or storm drains

Other Items

- ◆ Furniture, appliances, water heaters, sinks, televisions, and related items may be placed on the curb or adjacent to the back alley
- ◆ Boxes, crates, cartons, newspapers, magazines, catalogs, and like printed matter must be broken down and securely fastened into bales or bundles and weighing no more than 25 pounds and not exceeding four feet in any dimension
- ◆ Do not place the items within 15 feet of any utility pole, power line, mail box, car, fixtures, plants or other obstacles
- ◆ Do not place items that will block sidewalks, streets and/or back alley (must not obstruct traffic or pedestrians right of way)
- ◆ Do not cover water meters or storm drains with debris or roller carts

Types of Solid Waste Prohibited

- ◆ Hazardous waste of any kind, dirt, rocks, stumps, lead acid batteries, liquid waste, hazardous waste, radioactive waste, PCB (polychlorinated biphenyls), biomedical waste, tires, paint, acid, asbestos, liquid waste, etc.
- ◆ If you hire a contractor to do construction, repairs, demolition or improvement of your home or business, the contractor is responsible for removing debris such as (lumber, plaster, roofing, concrete, bricks or similar materials, etc.) (a roll off container is recommended for use)
- ◆ Any tree(s) removed by a contractor must be removed from the property and not left at the curb or back alley (tree(s), trunk(s), stump(s), and other debris must be removed by contractor).
- ◆ Appliances containing freon such as refrigerators, freezers or air conditioning units will not be collected unless freon has been removed and labeled by a qualified technician
